- 1. CALL TO ORDER** - The May 19, 2022, Lebanon School District and City Council Joint Partnership Task Force Meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM.

Present: School Board Chairman Richard Milius, Mayor Timothy McNamara, City Councilor Karen Liot-Hill, School Board Member Martha DiDomenico. Participating Remotely: School Board Member Stephen Kantor, City Councilor Douglas Whittlesey. Staff Present: City Manager Shaun Mulholland, Superintendent Joanne Roberts (remotely).

2. ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES:

MOTION made by Chairman Milius to accept the minutes of January 27, 2022, second by Mayor McNamara. Roll call vote, motion passed by all members voting yes except School Board member Kantor who abstained.

3. NEW BUSINESS:
