- I. **CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order at about 5:30pm.
- II. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** Minutes from 12/1/25 were approved without revision
- III. **OLD BUSINESS**

A. Agenda items A, B, and C –West Lebanon Main Street Trees

The Board met with Jim LaMontagne and Rod Finley (both present via Zoom) to continue our discussion of the choice and placement of trees for the West Lebanon Main Street project (see TAB 12/1/25 minutes for our previous discussion).

Jim and Rod shared revised plans they received from the project Architect in which he attempted to address some of our concerns. However, his suggestions did not include enough native trees. Jim presented some revisions that included more natives.

We went over the plans and recommendations in great detail, discussing changes and additions that would better satisfy our preference for natives, meet the significant challenges of the site, provide sufficient shade, and give some fall and spring color. We settled on a list of possibilities that Jim will explore further and come up with a final plan.

In addition to those already agreed on, these include: *Ostrya virginiana* (Hop Hornbeam), *Cercis Canadensis* (Redbud), *Nyssa Sylvatica* (Black Gum), *Gleditsia triacanthos* (Honey Locust), Hawthorne, *Carpinus Carolinian* (**American Hornbeam**)???

We also discussed whether IRA Grant money could be used to pay for the Kilton trees since they weren't part of the original project since the elms were still alive when the plan was done.
